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I. Need for Multidimensional Analysis

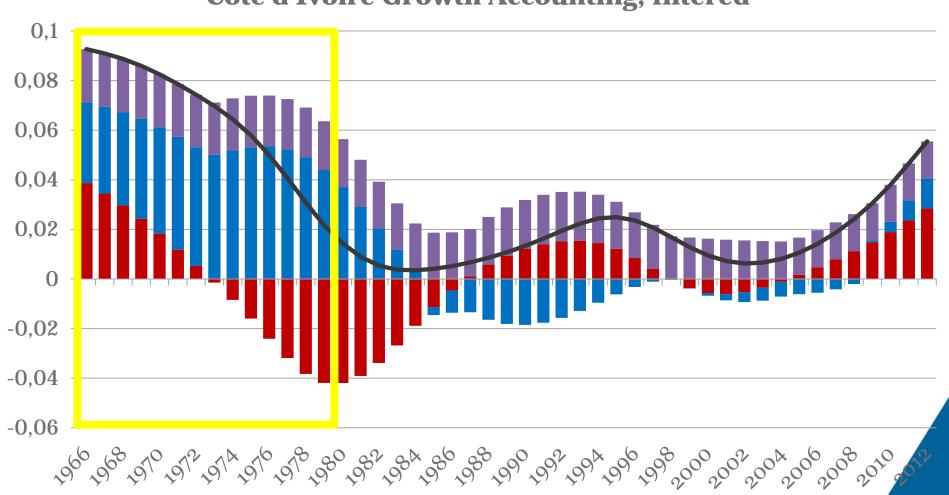
- A lower middle income country
- 5% average GDP growth since 1990
- A primary enrolment rate of 100% since 2008
- 80% healthcare coverage of the population
- 3% fiscal deficit
- Good reformer in Doing Business
- → Tunisia before the Arab Spring

- Average growth rate of over 8% for the last two decades
- High capital investment rates
- Booming exports

→ Cote d'Ivoire 1980

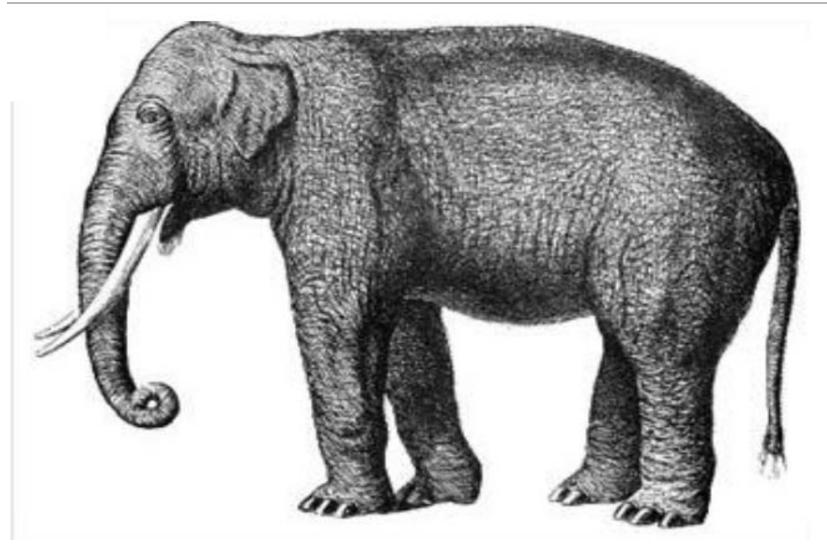


Cote d'Ivoire Growth Accounting, filtered



■Capital ■Travail —GDP





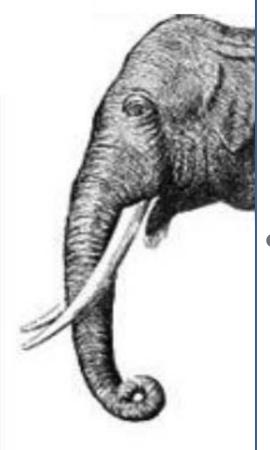


Supply side economics only

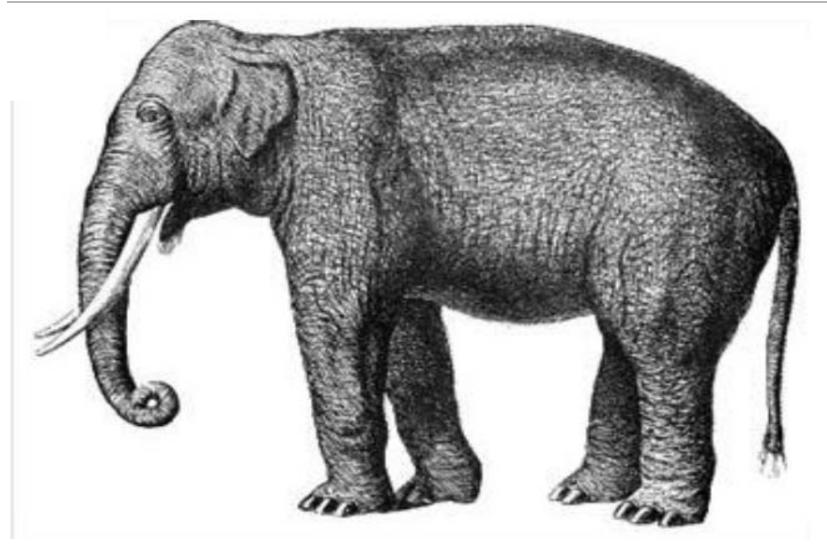

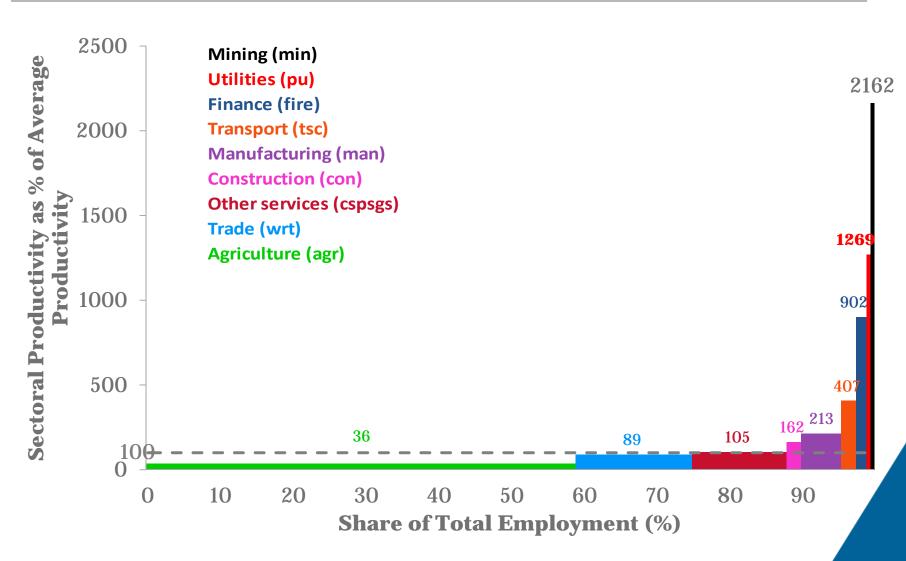

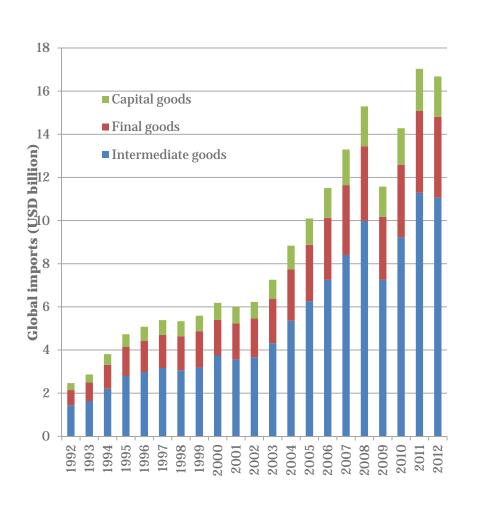
Huge sectoral productivity gaps make structural transformation a challenge

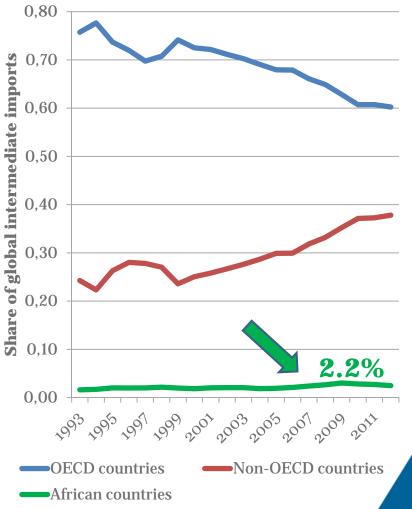






Global Value Creation is happening elsewhere









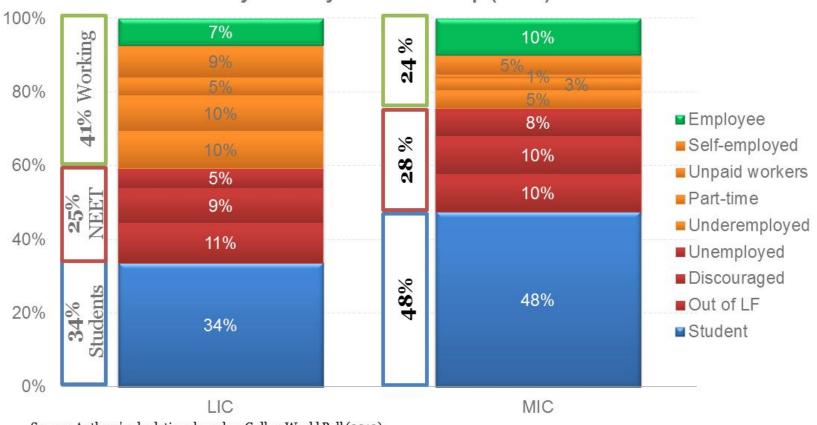
Meeting Africa's education needs

Youth time use by Country Income Group (2010)



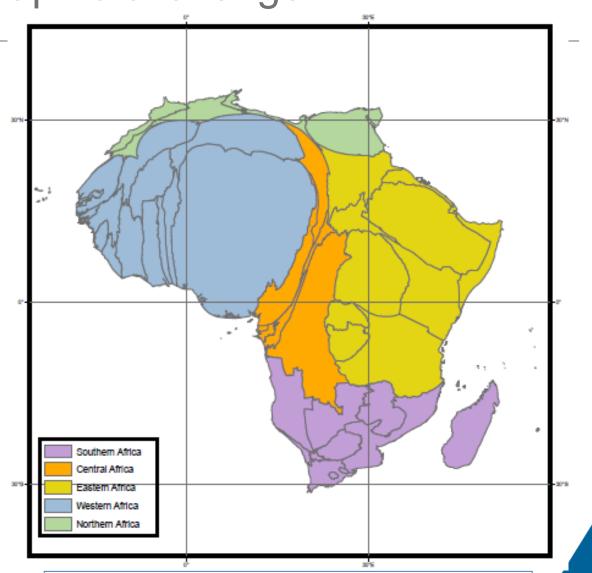

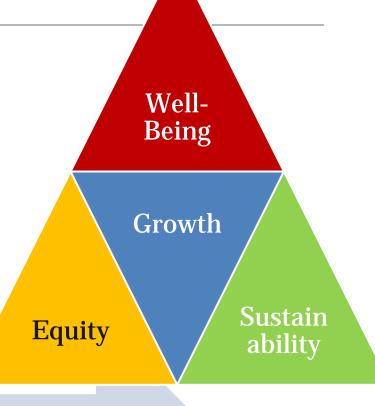


Multidimensional Country Reviews:

Objectives

 Identify the binding constraints to development in a country and suggest a strategy with specific policy recommendations and reform sequencing

 Looking not just at absolute levels, but at how the underlying dynamics of a country's development process affect these objectives



1. Identify key constraints to development

2. Develop policy recommendations

3. Support the government to turn these recommendations into concrete strategy



Methodology developed in MDCRs

- Quantitative analysis
 - Benchmarking: Comparative exercise evaluates the performance of the country in 15 dimensions
 - Tool Box: Well-Being Framework, Economic analysis (Growth analytics, product space, etc.), OECD tools (structural policy indicators, e.g.: EPL, PMR).
- Qualitative analysis (workshops)
 - Complement quantitative analysis (identification of priorities and bottlenecks, scenario building, strategy refinement)
 - Facilitate systematic interaction and participation of national stakeholders
 - Help create shared ownership of the process across government



Multidimensional frameworks to assess well-being outcomes and development performance

Benchmarking tool

Evaluation of the performance of the country in several dimensions using a group of comparable countries

- 1. Structural dimensions (natural endowments, demographics...)
- 2. Macro stability
- 3. Infrastructure
- 4. Health
- 5. Education
- 6. Security
- 7. Accessible and efficient financial sector
- 8. Effective state (revenues, quality of institutions, business friendly regulations...)

Well-Being Framework

OECD framework adapted to developing countries.

 - 3. Housing and infrastructure

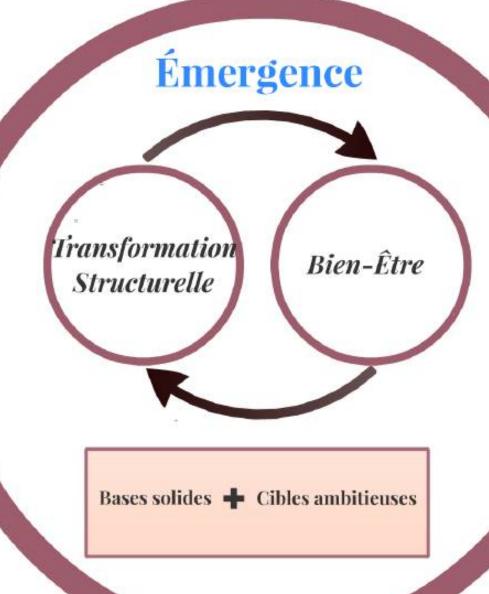
